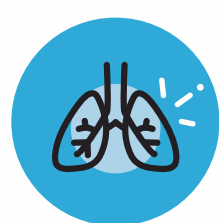


Feeding and swallowing difficulties (also known as dysphagia, “dis-fay-juh”) may occur in infants and children at any age.
